Your DofE programme is a real adventure.
It doesn't matter who you are or where you're from.
You just need to be aged between 14 and 24.

You can do DofE programmes at three levels:

- **Bronze** (Year 9)
- **Silver** (Year 10)
- **Gold** (aged 16+)

The award is highly regarded by future employers and helps to develop key life skills

You will have the chance to complete the Bronze Award.

To do so you will complete a personal programme of activities in four sections:

- **Volunteering:** undertaking service to individuals or the community.
- **Physical:** improving in an area of sport, dance or fitness activities.
- **Skills:** developing practical and social skills and personal interests.
- **Expedition:** planning, training for and completion of an adventurous journey in the UK.

Bronze Award

Volunteering	Physical	Skills	Expedition
3 months	3 months	3 months	Complete training and practice expedition. Plan and complete a 2 day, 1 night expedition

*All participants must undertake a **further** 3 months in the Volunteering, Physical or Skills section.*

Only 1 hour a week counts

Volunteering categories

- Helping people

- Coaching, teaching and leadership
- Working with the environment or animals
- Helping a charity or community organisation

Assessors and evidence

Who can be the assessor?

- Somebody who is not a family member
- Could be a teacher, coach, instructor, charity shop worker
- Somebody who witnesses the activity or evidence of it

What evidence is needed?


- A completed log sheet
- An assessor report
- Photographs, drawings, physical evidence e.g. baking

Where does the evidence go?

- Once enrolled each pupil will have an eDofE account in which they upload their evidence onto

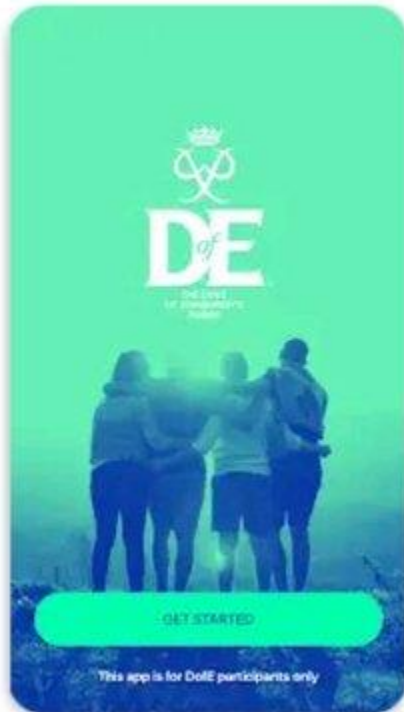

- To inspire young people to develop initiative and a sense of adventure and discovery, by planning, training for and completing an adventurous journey as part of a team.

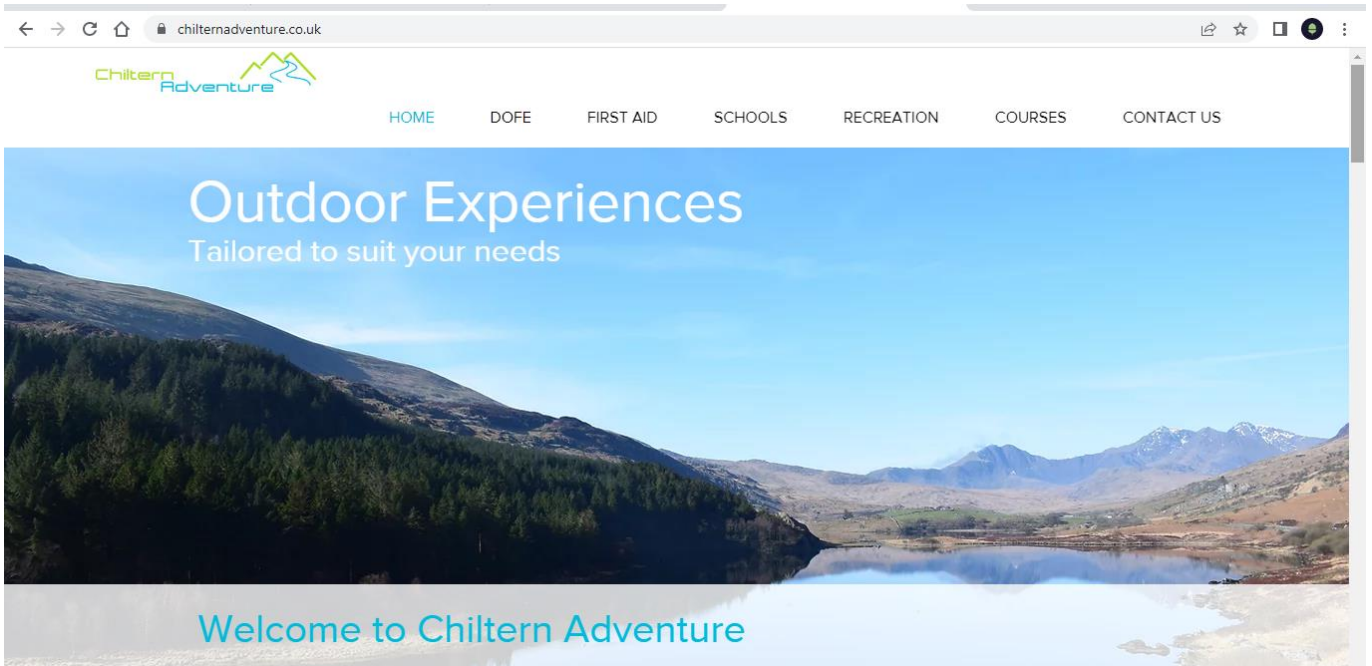
June 10/11th Training/Practice:
