<p>The Art curriculum ensures pupils can explore the different opportunities art provides and understand the purpose of the subject</p> <p>At the core of every project is the design process:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Key skills • Analysis • Investigation • Experimentation • Creation • Evaluation <p>Pupils explore artists, designers, cultures and art movements to develop the design process</p> <p>The concepts of colour and line are taught and pupils develop their skills, understanding and application through different mediums and on different surfaces with various prompts</p> <p>Vocabulary is used to explain and express understanding, context and knowledge of techniques</p>	<p>Case Study 1 - Painting</p>	<p>Exploring the purpose and impact of art in the real world encourages pupils to experience local and national exhibitions and installations</p> <p>Exhibitions and displays give pupils the opportunity to display their artwork to the wider school community</p> <p>Visiting artists provide pupils with an opportunity to discuss art with an expert and consider careers in the arts</p> <p>Art days allow primary pupils to work collaboratively on joint projects</p> <p>Art, craft and photography clubs</p> <p>Pupils engage with living practitioners through the use of Instagram</p>	<p>A wide range of artists are studied which cover historical, contemporary, British and global links</p> <p>Pupils can focus on their own cultural identity and express their feelings and background through their artwork</p> <p>Artwork from different cultures is displayed</p>
